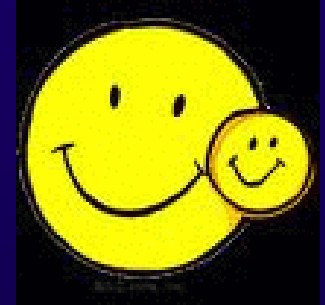

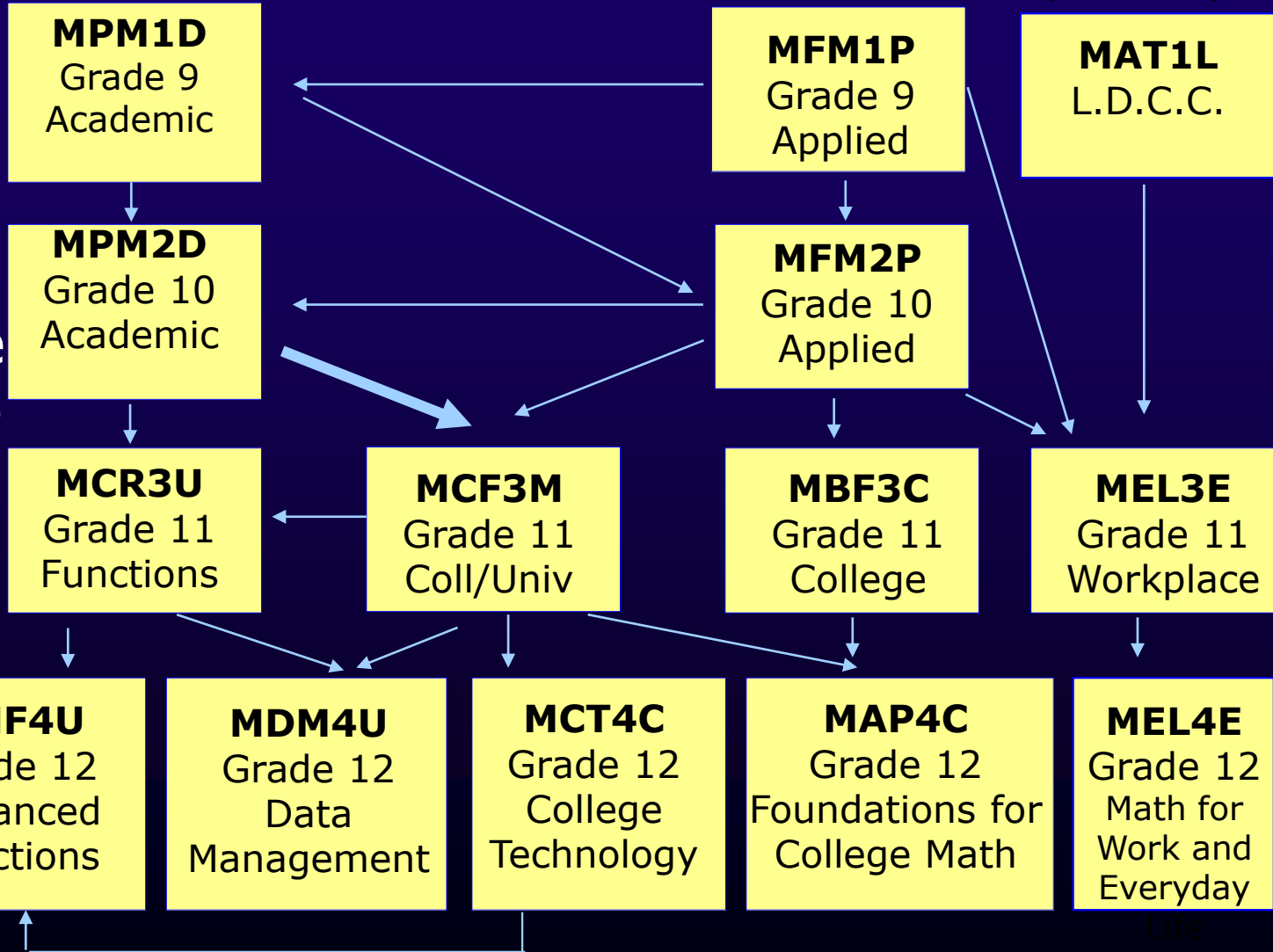


Mathematics

- Universities require **6 courses**
 - 4U and 4M courses are used to calculate the entrance average
 - Last year the program averages at Western ranged from 83.5% to 90.0% depending on the program
 - Colleges may look at grade 11 and 12 marks for program entrance (program specific)

NOT RETURNING?

Are you **sure** that you are going to college, university or work next year?

Please choose **NOT RETURNING** on myBlueprint, have it signed and return it to Guidance.

If you are **not sure** ... register for courses at IDC I – you can always drop them once you are accepted to university or college.

COURSE LOAD

- All students in their final year are expected to be full-time students (**minimum of 3 courses per semester**)
 - Students can take a **maximum of 4 courses per semester** including virtual and night school courses (exception-dual-credit)

THE REGISTRATION PROCESS

- 1) - read your Course Selection Guide
- make your course decisions
 - 2) **Register your courses on myBlueprint at home**
 - 3) If you need help registering on myBlueprint see your Guidance counsellor
 - 4) MyBlueprint registration must be returned to your **Semester two** homeroom teacher and **signed by a parent if you are not 18 by February 22nd**
