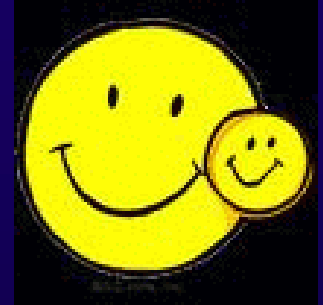



myBLUEPRINT & REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

Go to www.myblueprint.ca/tvdsb .

Click: Login with school account.

Enter your Student Login ID (lastfirs123@tvdsb.ca) and password (school password).

From the top left of the Home Screen, click "Submit Courses".

In the **High School Planner**, click "ADD ENGLISH" to open the course screen.

Select the appropriate English course and click 'Add Course'.

Add 8 courses for Grades 9, 10, 11 and minimum 6 courses for Grade 12.

If selecting Cooperative Education (Co-op), Leadership or a Specialist High Skills Major, you must complete an application form (available in Guidance) and return it to Guidance before March break.

Choose **2 alternate courses** (*in case a course is cancelled or is full*).

If you are **not returning**, choose NOTRET. If you want to return for semester one only, choose SEMONE. If you want to return for semester two only, choose SEMTWO.

Click on "Submit (Step 1 of 2)".

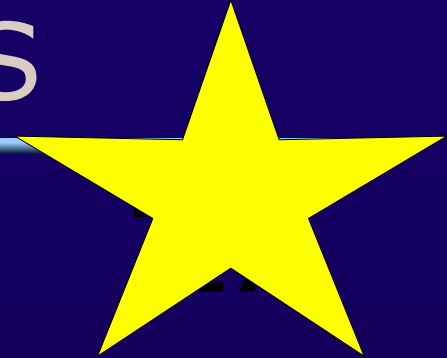
Review your course selections and click "Submit (Step 2 of 2)".

Print the sign off sheet, and have it signed by a parent/guardian.

Submit the myBlueprint course selection sign-off sheet to your homeroom teacher by Friday, February 22nd.

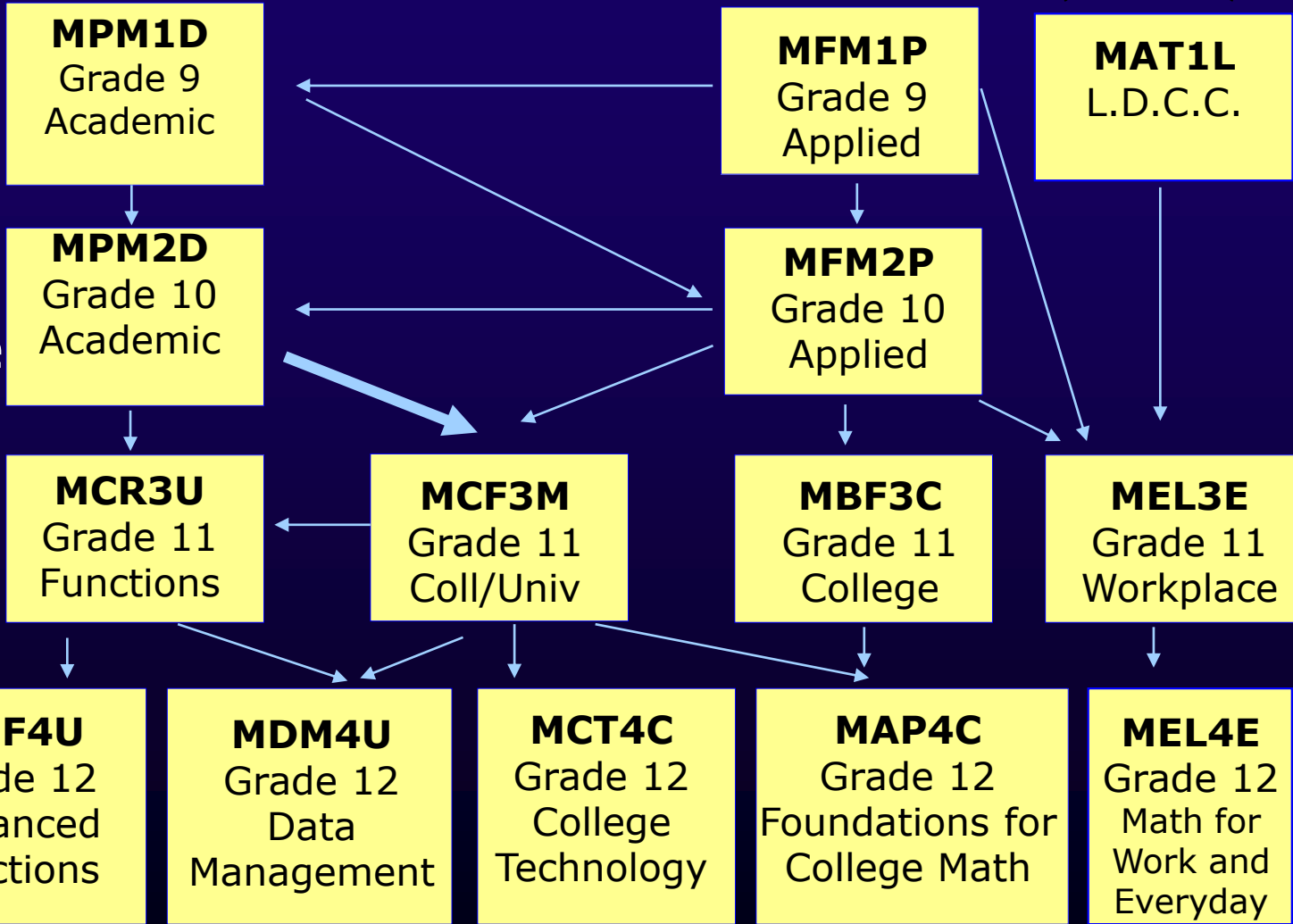
